Treaty Settlement Signing

Saturday the 25th of May 2013 will go down in history as the day we signed our Deed of Settlement with the Crown. It was a very special and emotional day for our Hapū.

The day began with a warm welcome to our whanaunga and local guests. Later, the pūtātara (shell trumpet) called the dignitaries who were then faced with a fearsome wero and haka pōwhiri.

After the powhiri Hon. Dr Pita Sharples (Minister of Māori Affairs) said a few words. The Minister of Treaty Negotiations, Hon. Chris Finlayson then spoke of congratulations, acknowledgements and our settlement.

"The Crown has acknowledged significant breaches in your settlement. I know the Hapū fought against these breaches." Hon. Chris Finlayson

The mood became very solemn as he then read out the Crown's breaches of the Treaty and their apology. The mamae could be seen on the faces of our people as we remembered injustices our tīpuna faced and the effects that still impact us and our taonga today.

Our kaumātua and Chairman of Maungaharuru-Tangitū Incorporated (MTI), Bevan Taylor, then acknowledged the Crown's apology.

The rebuilding of our Hapū's relationship with the Crown has begun but much more must be

done to attempt to right the wrongs of the past.

After the Ministers and the Maungaharuru-Tangitū Trust (MTT) Trustees signed the Deed, our Kuia and Koroua put pen to paper as they recalled the more than 20 years we have been working towards this day. Great queues of whānau waited for their turn to sign as witnesses, while entertained by our Kapa Haka, singers and band. Taonga were presented to those who had key roles in the negotiations.

Tangitū and Maungaharuru were filled with people enjoying the hākari, reflecting on what was a momentous occasion. We then partied into the night!

MTI & MTT AGMs

The AGMs for both MTI and MTT were held on Saturday 29 June 2013. It was a big year for MTI, culminating in the signing of the Deed of Settlement and the receipt of the cash part of the settlement. It is now time for our new entity, MTT, to take effect. The initial focus will be on developing a strategic plan, further negotiations, preparing the Maungaharuru-Tangitū group, exploring options to protect Tangoio Marae, and preserving and protecting Hapū information.
