They are whānau who are enthusiastic, fit and happy to work outdoors on restoration projects within our takiwā. Our Manu Tāiko are learning about our whenua, taonga species, Hapū and kōrero tuku iho.

Whakanuia ō tātau Whānau

E ai ki te kōrero, 'Ki te tau te puanani ki te wāhi mōmona, ka tipu. Ki te tau te puanani ki te wāhi tītōhea, kāore i tipu'. Ko tā tātau he whakahaumako i te whenua ki te wai māori, ki te wairākau kia matomato ai te tipu o te puanani, ā, mā konā e rīrā ai te tū.

Tau atu, tau atu, he wawata tō tēnā, tō tēnā. Ahakoa ngā whakakōroiroi o ngā tau tata nei ka hori, e kore rawa te wawata e mimiti noa. Me tuku tonu i ō tātau manako nui ki a Hiwa-i-te-rangi ahakoa, ahakoa. Kia kore te wawata, kua noho tūreikura te tangata.

I te Maramataka nei, ka whakanuia ngā wawata i wawatatia ai, ngā wawata i whakatutuki anō hoki ai i tō tātau taiao. Me whakanui ka tika te whakatutukitanga o ngā tūmanako. E tika ana kia mānawatia te angitūtanga! It is said that 'if wind-dispersed seeds settle on fertile land, they will grow. If they settle on infertile land, they will not grow' It is up to all of us to make sure that our land is fertile so that vigorous growth may occur.

Every year, we all have aspirations. Even though we have been through some trying times lately, our hopes and dreams will never fade. We should continue to send our desires towards Hiwa-i-te-rangi. It is to Hiwa-i-te-rangi, the youngest star of the Matariki cluster, that our tīpuna would send their dreams and desires for the new year in the hope that they would be realised.

In this Maramataka, we celebrate our whānau, our environment and our aspirations that have come to fruition.

Our Manu Tāiko rangers are gaining new skills including 4WD driver training, conservation skills and Te Reo Māori.

One national initiative is called "Wasp Wipeout". Introduced wasps are one of the most damaging insect pests in Aotearoa. They harm our native birds and insects. First tītī chick hatches on Maungaharuru

The Poutiri Ao-ō-Tāne project began in 2011, with an ambitious goal to return birdlife, including tītī, to Maungaharuru. This was the first experimental project in the world to shift seabirds well away from the coast up into the mountains. Tītī chicks were gifted by Ngāti Manuhiri from Te Hauturu-o-Toi (Little Barrier Island). They fledged on Maungaharuru and then flew tens of thousands of kilometres, spending years at sea. Tītī have started to return to Maungaharuru. A pair has mated and in March 2022 a tīti chick was hatched on Maungaharuru for the first time in hundreds of years!

The chick was named 'Papauma' by kaumātua Mātiu Eru.
